JOLIE HAS LONG HELD AN INTEREST IN NATIVE AMERICAN-ANTHROPOLOGIST RELATIONS, REPATRIATION MATTERS, AND BROADER ETHICAL PRACTICE WITHIN THE DISCIPLINE. IN HIS RESEARCH AND APPLIED SCHOLARSHIP, HE STRIVES TO CULTIVATE COLLABORATIVE RELATIONSHIPS AND PARTNERSHIPS WITH NATIVE AMERICANS AND OTHER DESCENDANT COMMUNITIES THAT ARE DRIVEN BY THE NEEDS AND CONCERNS OF THE COMMUNITIES THEMSELVES.
